Does submitting your research manuscripts for publication feel like running the gauntlet? In this presentation, our Editors share insights on how to prepare your manuscript text and figures to increase the odds of a streamlined and successful peer review process. We'll present characteristics of a manuscript which increase acceptance rates and describe the overall submission and peer review process for *Medical Physics*. We will address common questions concerning interpreting the manuscript critique, how to address the revision process, the scientific topics of interest to *Medical Physics*, and review the authors options for publishing an Open Access article.
